2025 AltWheels Fleet Day Successfully Leads in Sustainable Transportation

Norwood, MA – October 15, 2025 – The 22nd annual AltWheels Fleet Day, held on Monday, October 6 at the Four Points by Sheraton in Norwood, celebrated another milestone year in advancing sustainable transportation solutions. With over 350 attendees representing 30+ fleets from 16 states, this year’s event continued its tradition as one of the nation’s premier forums for fleet managers, policymakers, and clean transportation innovators.

The 2025 conference featured two dynamic-MCs — Scott Bradley, Director of Sales and Strategy Partnerships at Pioneer e-Mobility, and Sejal Shah, Lead Program Manager at National Grid — who guided the day’s sessions. Attendees engaged in a full day of keynote presentations, panels, and networking, along with the popular Lunch With Experts sessions and Ride & Drive vehicle showcase featuring 29 advanced technology vehicles.

As Event Director Meg Farrer shared, “Each year, AltWheels Fleet Day brings together the people and technologies that are redefining what’s possible in sustainable fleet management. The 2025 event not only showcased innovation—it underscored our

shared responsibility to lead the transition toward a cleaner, more resilient transportation future.”

Keynote and Panels

Morning Keynote speaker Chris Harto, Senior Transportation and Policy Analyst at Consumer Reports, delivered an in-depth presentation titled “Clean Vehicles: Charging Ahead in an Uncertain Policy Environment,” outlining the shifting federal and state policy landscapes and the accelerating adoption of electric vehicles. Afternoon keynote speaker, Adam Wint, presented “Emerging Trends Impacting Fleet Operations.” His focus was that managing a fleet has never been more complex. With more data, more solutions, more technology – all promising to solve for the growing number of challenges you face – it’s a struggle to sift through the noise to find what truly matters.

Panels and presentations throughout the day addressed critical topics such as fleet electrification programs, charging infrastructure development, and marine sustainability — a new addition to the 2025 program, featuring participation from Boston Harbor Now and Shred Electric.

Additional presentations from organizations including National Grid, Pioneer e-Mobility, Nuvera, Shred Electric, Sprague, and the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center showcased the latest in clean energy technology, hydrogen-powered charging solutions, and fleet transition resources.

AltWheels is a nonprofit initiative dedicated to promoting alternative transportation solutions that reduce emissions, improve air quality, and lower costs. Through its annual Fleet Day conference and related programs, AltWheels fosters collaboration among fleet managers, manufacturers, policymakers, and advocates working to build a cleaner transportation future.
