™SNAPSHOT OF 2023 ALTWHEELS FLEET DAY

Clean energy experts and officials provided guidance on how to navigate the energy transition to more than 300 fleet managers and government leaders during the 20th annual AltWheels Fleet Day, the largest meeting of corporate and municipal Fleet Managers on the East Coast (www.altwheels.org).

The 20th anniversary event, coincided with the 30th anniversary celebration of the Clean Cities Coalition Network, was held at the Four Points by Sheraton in Norwood. The event featured panels, exhibits, test drives, an address by EPA Region 1 administrator David W. Cash and a specially taped recorded welcome from Jay Leno!

AWARDS

The day finished with the presentation of a series of Sustainable Mobility Leadership Awards in recognition of the progress the transportation industry has made over the last 20 years and those who have led the way.
