SNAPSHOT OF 2022 ALTWHEELS FLEET DAY

Focusing on helping Fleets to Build a Future Roadways Toolkit, Fleet Day drew 300 attendees, 35 speakers, 29 sponsors, 28 exhibitors, 20 co-hosts, and 20 display/ride and drive vehicles for demos from more than nine states.

Organizers added a cocktail hour to give attendees more time to network, visit exhibitor tables and to test drive some of the vehicles on-site. Vehicles on display or available for ride and drive this year included a 2020 Hino 195 16' Moving Truck powered by the all-electric SEA-Electric sea-drive; a Hydrogen Nexo, Toyota RAV4 Prime, Prius Prime and Mirai; a 2022 F-150 Lightning EV Truck and a DC Fast Charger, a BYD 8Y terminal tractor, XL Fleet Hybrid Upfit Van, ZEVx All-Electric Ford F-250, GreenPower EV Star Cargo Van (25'), Anderson Blue Bird 2022 Blue Bird Micro Bird Type A 29 Passenger School Bus powered by Girardin's Ecotune Electric Power Train, the Town of Shrewsbury's Electric & cable (SELCO) mustang Mach E and others. There was also Pioneer Power Mobility e-Boost Mobile unit onsite in Norwood for charging any electric vehicles that needed a boost.
