



Our 21st anniversary AltWheels Fleet Day, on Monday, October 7 in Norwood, MA, was the most successful ever!

Clean energy experts and officials provided guidance on how to navigate the energy transition to more than **350 fleet managers and government leaders** during the largest meeting of corporate and municipal Fleet Managers focused on sustainability on the East Coast.



We received great feedback on the morning keynote from Britta Gross, Director of Transportation, Electric Power Research Institute, about the overall state of where we are in the Energy Transition. Attendees also found the afternoon keynote from Mike Scarpino, Transportation Project Engineer, US Department of Transportation, to be very helpful with an update on the NEVI Funding Awarded in the Northeast.



Panel topics this year included Fleet Operations Managers: Managing the Energy Transition; Navigating the Energy Transition: What is Coming Down the Pike; Bridging the Gap – Renewable Solutions; Innovations and Tools around Charging; and Electrifying at Scale: How do Fleets and Utilities Get from Here to There?



The 6 lunch with expert sessions were well attended and filled up early including sessions on the impact that China and Chinese EVs will have on the light, medium and heavy-duty market, public charging roadmap for the Northeast, funding for fleets, how to green your fleet, incorporating private fleet electrification into the Commonwealth's policy planning, and what it will take for your fleet technicians to get to zero carbon.

Britta Gross received the Stephen R. Connors Visionary Award at the end of the day for her pioneering work that has shaped this field.
